



## Fishabout Tours - Bonefish, Cuba

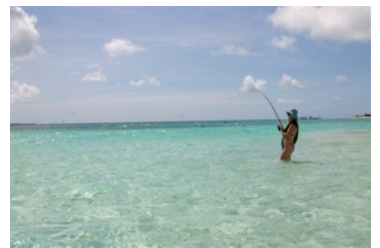
Where in the world can you fish more than 100 miles of flats without seeing another fisherman, a place where the flats fishing is so good that you can catch seven species of fish in one day? Welcome to Cuba - The ultimate Bonefish destination!

### DAY 1 - 2

Arriving in Camaguey will be a comforting relief after travelling from Sydney via LA and Cancun, but it is well worth the effort. You will have the afternoon to explore the city sights and experience some delicious Cuban cuisine.

Day 1  
1500 Arrive Camaguey  
1530 Transfer to hotel

Day 2  
0700 Transfer to Jucaro Port  
0900 Transfer to Tortuga  
1230 lunch  
1330 Afternoon fishing session



### DAY 3 - 6

Fishing hours are totally at your discretion. A normal day begins with breakfast at 7am then fishing from 7:45am on. Many anglers elect to return to the Tortuga for lunch, especially during the summer season. Some of the flats are within fifteen minutes of the boat, other days you will want to explore more distant flats that see little fishing pressure. In the Jardines, it is common to have stronger wind in the mornings but then later in the afternoon it will often be calm making for superb late afternoon and evening fishing, especially for bonefish.

### DAY 7

On your final day aboard the Tortuga you have the chance to get in one last fishing session before making your way back to port and onto Cancun for your flight home.

1300 Transfer Camaguey  
0600 Flight to Cancun





## Grand Slam

The species needed to achieve a Grand Slam or the Super Grand Slam for inshore fishing are, Tarpon, Bonefish, Permit and Snook. The Grand Slam is achieved when the angler lands three of these species on the same day. Or, in the case of the even more difficult Super Slam, when the angler lands 4 species in the same day. These angling milestones are unforgettable in the life of an angler. As complex and challenging as a 10 handicap in Polo, or a hole in one in golf, the Grand Slam and Super Slam will leave a huge impression on an angler, for life.

## Cuba Fishing

Fly fishing in Cuba is far different from other destinations in the Caribbean. Only in recent years has this flats fishery been developed, and you will be fishing waters that have not seen sport fishing for nearly fifty years. Flats fish like Tarpon, Permit, Bonefish, Snook, Mutton Snapper, Barracuda, and a variety of Jacks are found in incredible numbers.

## Food & Accommodation

The Tortuga functions as a floating hotel with seven guest cabins that accommodate two anglers each. The Tortuga is a massive, steel houseboat that is permanently secured in a small, protected channel of a big island, so that it never moves, regardless of bad weather or wind. It is extremely stable and level at all times so there is never any chance of guests getting seasick.

On the lower level you will find our large air conditioned dining room along with both a foredeck and afterdeck, chairs and tables that are perfect for setting up your tackle, tying flies or relaxing after a day of fishing. The foredeck is everyone's favourite place to enjoy appetisers like pizza and a beverage before dinner. A great spot to kick back, and relax, enjoy that perfect Mojito, or smoke a great Cuban cigar while swapping tales of the day's fishing.

Dining on board combines the flair of the best Continental Italian cuisine, wonderful fresh seafood every day and traditional Cuban favourites like rice and beans, black bean soup and fried bananas.
